Onslow Memorial Hospital (“Hospital”) is committed to adherence to all laws, rules, and regulations governing facility design, construction, and operation. The Hospital has established personnel and operating policies to ensure adherence to the laws, rules, and regulations governing facility design, construction, and operation.

**Safety Officer**

The Hospital has a dedicated Safety Officer who works closely with Plant Maintenance to ensure relevant corporate policies and procedures are in adherence with governmental guidelines. The Safety Officer has the primary responsibility of ensuring organizational adherence to environmental and operational laws rules and regulations, including, but not limited to:

- Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)
- Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) Handling
- Indoor Air Quality
- Air Pollutant Emission
- Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) Management
- Emergency Response
- Biomedical Waste Management
- Low-level Radioactive Waste Management
- Hazardous Waste Management
- Fuel Storage Tank Management
- Waste Oil Management
- Wastewater Discharge
- Potable (Drinking) Water Supply

**North Carolina Division of Facility Services and Certificate of Need**

The Hospital' Construction and Engineering Departments ensure compliance with North Carolina Division of Facility Services (DFS) rules and regulations governing new construction and renovation design, construction. In addition, these Departments report to State governing bodies such as DFS. The Construction and Engineering Departments have the assistance of the Planning Department for adherence to Certificate of Need laws, rules, and regulations for new project application and reporting requirements.

Operational responsibility for adherence to design, construction, and environmental laws, rules, and regulations resides within the departments and personnel described above. The Compliance Program is a mechanism available to these departments and personnel to report any potential violation of law, rule, or regulation not otherwise resolved through normal operational mechanisms.
